Masking Guidelines

School Transportation: Under a [CDC Order](#) issued in January 2021, the CDC requires masks, regardless of vaccination status, when on public transportation – this includes on school buses and vans operated by the private and public-school systems.

School Buildings: Effective Tuesday, February 15, 2022, the District will transition from the use of county-wide data to a building level matrix to determine whether masks are recommended or required on a weekly basis. The number of positive cases that were on campus during their infectious period will be tracked and posted to the website daily by building. The total number of positive cases by building, at the conclusion of each school week, will reflect the masking status for the upcoming week, based on the chart below.

| School Building | Total Population | Masks Recommended | Masks Required |
|--------------------------------|-------------------------|--------------------------|-----------------------|
| Corry Area Primary School | 514 | 0-8 | 9+ |
| Corry Area Intermediate School | 457 | 0-8 | 9+ |
| Corry Area Middle-High School | 1153 | 0-17 | 18+ |

The thresholds noted above represent approximately 1.5% of the student and staff population within each building. Exceeding a threshold for masks recommended indicates an increase in activity, which would require masks to slow the spread of the virus and possibly prevent a school closure.
