



Articulation Agreement Erie County Community College and Corry Area High School

INTRODUCTION

Erie County Community College and the Corry Area High School agree to establish an articulation agreement for the purpose of eliminating the duplication of instruction for secondary students entering a post-secondary environment. By this agreement, students who have mastered agreed upon competencies at the secondary level may be granted credit by Erie County Community College for equivalent courses. This agreement is based upon the Corry Area High School curriculum adoption of the Competency Based Program of Study developed by the PA Department of Education or locally approved task list for Career and Technical programs.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Before articulated credits will be awarded the following responsibilities must be fulfilled by prospective students:

- 1. Applicants must meet the standard admission criteria of Erie County Community College.
- 2. Applicants must inform the admission representative that they are applying for articulation credit under the terms of this articulation agreement.
- 3. The applicant must have achieved a grade of "B" or better in their career program at the Corry Area High School and attain an overall high school GPA of 3.00 All articulated credits are subject to the review and approval of Erie County Community College administration.
- 4. The applicant must achieve either the Pennsylvania Certificate of Competency or the Pennsylvania Skills Certificate in the technical program area. In addition, the applicant will present the program task list with all tasks assessed at the competent or advanced level.
- 5. All required materials must be submitted to Erie County Community College prior to the applicant's start date.
- 6. The applicant must start classes at Erie County Community College within one year upon graduating from the Corry Area High School to be considered for articulated credits.
- 7. Applicants must complete the enrollment process and enroll at Erie County Community College. In lieu of a letter grade, the applicant will receive a different (TBD) grade on their transcript designating that the applicant has received credit for the articulated courses.
- 8. The granting of these credits will be at no cost to the applicant. Students may audit classes where articulated credit has been awarded.

Either party may terminate the agreement at the time of annual review provided the party provides a written notice 90 days in advance.
